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a strikingly designed and richly illustrated retelling of the unique history of samoan tattooing from 3000 years ago to today the samoan islands are unusual in that tattooing has been continuously practised with indigenous techniques the design of the full maletattoo the pe a has evolved in subtle ways since the nineteenth century but remains as elaborate meaningful and powerful as it ever was this first history of samoan tatau explores the people encounters events and external forces that have defined samoan tattooing over many centuries stunningly illustrated with images of nineteenth and twentieth century and contemporary samoan tattoos along with intricate diagrams of designs and motifs tatau is the definitive guide to this rich and influential living art form

jean tekura mason's poetry reflects her life as a person living in two worlds polynesian and european some of her poems are reflective others are glib and deliberately so there is humour and there is passion of love and hate pagan faiths and christian beliefs ancestors and dancers customs and politics migrants and immigrants and pacific flora and fauna all have stimulated ms mason to put pen to paper at times incisive and descriptive and at others deeply moving this book is a collection of poems which is both retrospective perceptive back cover

in recent decades tattoos have gone from being a subculture curiosity in western culture to mainstream and commonplace this two volume set provides broad coverage of tattooing and body art in the united states today as well as around the world and throughout human history in the 1960s tattooing was illegal in many parts of the united states today tattooing is fully ingrained in mainstream culture and is estimated to be a multi billion dollar industry this exhaustive work contains approximately 400 entries on tattooing providing historical information that enables readers to fully understand the methods employed the meanings of and the motivations behind tattooing one of the most ancient ways humans mark themselves the encyclopedia covers all

important aspects of the topic of tattooing the major types of tattooing the cultural groups associated with tattooing the regions of the world where tattooing has been performed the origins of modern tattooing in prehistory and the meaning of each society's use of tattoos major historical and contemporary figures associated with tattooing including tattooists tattooed people and tattoo promoters receive due attention for their contributions the entries and sidebars also address the sociological movements involved with tattooing the organizations the media dedicated to tattooing such as television shows movies magazines websites and books and the popular conventions carnivals and fairs that have showcased tattooing

volume ii includes chapters on anthropology and sociology medicine plants and cooking fishery men's work ornamentation and dress recreation and war and flora and fauna

samoan art and artists is a wide ranging survey of both the traditional and contemporary arts of samoa the author has drawn on an extensive research base to present a contemporary and accessible picture of a vibrant culture the book has a broad sweep covering all facets of the samoan arts including canoe and house building siapo tapa weaving tattooing oratory adornment all forms of performance art the visual arts and literature an important feature of the book is the inclusion of profiles of living practitioners both from samoa and the large samoan communities in other pacific countries publisher description

the popularity of tattoos today is a revival of a practice begun in the late eighteenth century when westerners first made contact with the native peoples of the pacific the term tattoo entered europe with the publication of captain cook's voyages in the 1770s and pacific tattoos became fashionable in the west as sailors whalers and explorers brought home tattoos from tahiti the marquesas new zealand and polynesia in recent years these early contacts have been revived as native tattooists from oceania have begun tattooing non polynesians in europe the usa and elsewhere tattoo is both a fascinating book about these early oceanic european exchanges that also documents developments up to the present day and the first to look at the history of tattooing in oceania itself documenting these complex cultural interactions in the first part of the book the authors move from issues of encounter representation and exchange to the interventions of missionaries and the colonial state in local tattoo practices highly illustrated with many previously unseen images for example the original voyage sketches of the first russian circumnavigation of 1803 6 this is a fascinating account of early tattooing and cultural exchange in oceania and will appeal to the wide audience interested in the history of tattooing

the book is an essential resource for those interested in investigating the lives histories and futures of indigenous peoples around the world perfect for readers looking to learn more about cultural groups around the world this four volume work examines approximately 400 indigenous groups globally the encyclopedia investigates the history social structure and culture of peoples from all corners of the world including their role in the world their politics and their customs and traditions alphabetically arranged entries focus on groups living in all world regions some of which are well known with large populations and others that are lesser known with only a handful of surviving members each entry includes sections on the group s geography and environment history and politics society culture and tradition access to health care and education and threats to survival each entry concludes with see also cross references and a list of further reading resources to guide readers in their research also included in the encyclopedia are native voices inset boxes allowing readers a glimpse into the daily lives of members of these indigenous groups as well as an appendix featuring the united nations declaration on the rights of indigenous peoples

when tatau was first published in 2010 mark adams renowned images documenting a great polynesian art tradition were a revelation it told the story of the late suluape paulo ii the pre eminent figure of modern samoan tattooing a brilliantly innovative and often controversial man he saw tatau as an art of international importance tatau documented his practice and that of other tufuga ta tatau tattoo artists in the contexts of polynesian tattooing samoan migrant communities and new zealand art long out of print this revised and extended new edition with its handsome large format and texts by distinguished scholars makes a cultural treasure available once more

indigenous architectures of samoa are restricted by the formal appearances associated with them traditional samoan approaches to space and place can be used as drivers in evolving westernized architectural typologies ones which whilst not formally samoan in appearance may still embody traditional samoan principles and relationships by referring to these traditional values most apparent in the fale tele this thesis begins a critical discussion around generating a new samoan and further arching oceanic architecture this discussion is a process based on the applying of a tatau the traditional tattoo art of samoa tatau is both the process and architectural language in negotiating a new samoan architecture paralleling the steps in the tatau s application the methodology is orientated around three stages first through the creation of a literary ink body core relationships are excavated within the fale tele to ground the project in samoan culture then by observing the landscape s condition strategies are implemented to address the site as a whole finally manipulation of the site s skin was undertaken by applying a tatau negotiating new relationships between site ecologies and traditional spatial concepts enables a new site specific samoan architecture to be created it was found that through redefining site geometrically into patterning reminiscent of the tatau triangulation and tatauing it with further geometric relationships descriptive of site three dimensional geometries could be fostered which are highly site specific inscribing the site through the tatau generated a relationship between the traditional two dimensional tatau and the resultant space furthermore negotiations between the space and its ecological function embedded the result in both culture and place the site programme is typologically a plantation a native bush restorative platform and research centre hybrid through which the building establishes a connection to the environmental fabric of the site this project encourages a societal involvement within this it is a building which is highly site specific through the reintroduction of rare endemic plant life and is traditionally reflective in the ways in which it achieves this the significance in these findings is that traditional cultural practices namely tatau in

this study may hold the key to producing cultural processes which challenge and exceed contemporary standards in this architectural representation tatau provides a means for samoan negotiations of space to be pushed outside of the fale without losing the relationships which are culturally important significance is found in the negotiation between tradition and the contemporary through the societal use of the building the manner in which it addresses fears of climate change and the tatau like architectural language in which it achieves this it is a project based on the tatau generating a new site specific samoan architecture it is a project which seeks the relevance of the past within contemporary modes of architectural thought
